Collection and Drop-off Areas



What we have been up to in Foundation Phase....

<u>Grade 1</u> – Miss Bayley

The Grade Ones started the week with the theme 'The Solar System'.

With much excitement, they have learnt the names of all 8 planets and the order in which they occur from the sun. They also learnt many fun and exciting facts about each planet, and that poor Pluto was not big enough to be called a planet.



They were then asked to pretend to be a certain planet, to remember a fact about their chosen planet and to physically show how their planet revolves around the sun.





Grade 2 – Miss Angus



The Grade 2's have been very busy since the beginning of the term. They worked together to design and **create their own 3D community**; using only recycled materials. The concept of halving larger numbers was introduced, along with 'sharing blocks' so that they could grasp the idea using concrete apparatus.

The Grade 3A's thoroughly enjoyed looking up relevant facts on a sea creature of their choice. They applied their **research skills** using encyclopedias, factual books and the internet to source information. The end result was amazing and they gained valuable knowledge from this exercise.




Subject focus: First Additional Languages

Grade 4 - 7 Afrikaans ~ Mev. Janse van Rensburg

During Term 2, we covered language structures, for example; we did idioms, active and passive, direct and indirect speech, to name a few. We also focused on creative writing this term. We wrote our own poems and the Grade 4's and 5's designed an advertisement. The Grade 6's designed a poster about saving water and the Grade 7's wrote an information text about Leonardo da Vinci. All grades have continued reading their prescribed book and answered comprehension questions based on texts.





<u>Grade 4 − 7 IsiZulu</u> ~ Nkosazane Mhlongo & Nkosikazi Vilakazi

Grade 4 and 5 students are learning about domestic (Izilwane zasekhaya) and wild animals (Izilwane zasendle), emphasizing different phonics and how they are pronounced, for example; hh- ihhashi, bh- ibhubesi, nj- inja. They also covered rhyming words and engaged in different rhymes, such as; tsh - Katshana Katshana (Cat-Cat), song mb - Imbongolo ka John (John's donkey). At the end of this topic, learners had to choose an animal to speak about and create masks of that particular animal.





The Garde 6 learners were doing a comprehension text from their core reader about the Soweto Riots (Iziphithiphithi Zase Soweto).

They researched the famous photograph of Hector Pietersen which was taken in June 1976 and how the journalist, who was recently buried, made history and informed the media about the incident.

They also made posters with slogans, that highlighted concerns that were raised during that time, such as the use of Afrikaans as the only medium of instruction. They used cue cards to debate the negative and positive effects of Apartheid.



They discussed the historical facts of the Apartheid era and Bantu Education.

In preparation for the upcoming Exams, the Grade 7's have been sharpening their comprehension skills, extending their vocabulary and improving the writing and answering techniques.

Grade 7 Mid-year Examinations

The Grade 7 Mid-year examinations will take place from the $9 - 19^{th}$ of July. The children received their exam breakdown booklets and timetable this week.

• Students will write two examinations per day and two Study Days have been allocated:

EXAMINATION SESSION 1: 07h40 - 09h40 EXAMINATION SESSION 2: 10h00 - 12h00

• From the 9 – 17 July, students may go home once their examinations are complete, and children may stay at home on Study Days.

Wednesday, 18 July is Mandela Day. Students must remain at school until 13h30 for our Mandela Day 67-minutes community initiative.

Thursday, 19 July, is a <u>non-compulsory</u> **school day.** It will be an **Exam Catch-up Day** for students that were absent for an examination due to illness (a doctor's note must be provided).

- There will be **study supervision** for those who are unable to go home after examinations or stay at home on the allocated Study Days.
- School bus times: will remain as normal (13h45, 15h00 and 16h30).
- There will be NO compulsory <u>school extramural activities</u> during the examinations (9 17 July).
